


Topic A: Combating the Threat of Emerging Diseases


Topic: Conference of Latin American Revolutionaries


CRISIS



Topic: The Russian Provisional Government of 1917
Level: Advanced

The world remembers and continues to be shaped by the effects of the Russian October Revolution in 1917, in which communists seized control of Russia and transformed it into the Soviet Union. Yet months before, the nation dramatically forced the Tsar to abdicate and installed liberal reformers to lead the empire through its most turbulent period.

Set at the crossroads of history, delegates will grapple with the challenges faced by the Provisional Government as it navigated the complex transition from the autocratic rule of the Romanovs to a democratic system, all against the backdrop of the ongoing World War I.



Ad Hoc Committee of the Director-General
Level: Advanced

POSITION PAPER GUIDELINES

Format:

- Length: One page for each topic (meaning GA should have two pages of total content, and Spec Bod should have one)
 - If the addition of footnotes pushes content to an extra half page per topic, this is acceptable
- Margins: 1 inch
- Font: Times New Roman, 12 pt.
- Spacing: Single-Spaced
- Aligned left on the first line of the first page for each topic, type: Committee Name, Topic, Country
- **Do not include the name of your school or your name** anywhere in the position paper
- The bibliography should be on its own page and does not count toward the page count

Sections to Include:

- General Assembly
 - Topic Background
 - Past UN/International Action
 - County Policy
 - Proposed Solutions
- Specialized Body
 - Topic Background
 - Character Position (Delegates should research their character and extrapolate what their stance on the topic realistically might be)
 - Proposed Actions

Notes:


- Position Papers will be required to be eligible for a Research Award in General Assembly and Specialized Body. Delegates in Crisis or Ad Hoc will not be required to write a Position Paper.
- Papers will be judged on content quality over quantity or format
- You are welcome to request feedback regarding your position paper after the conference
